IN THE SPOTLIGHT: CHERYL YOUNG DEKNATEL

Cheryl Young Deknatel

When we spoke in early March, Cheryl Deknatel was eagerly awaiting the debut of *HOUDINI'S LAST HANDCUFFS*, the book she co-authored with her brother, Charlie Young, to be published by Vine Leaves Press on March 26th.

When three young friends in 1950s Manhattan receive a mystical Ouija Board from writer, Walter Gibson, on the 30th anniversary of Harry Houdini's death, the trio is thrust into a world of magic and wonder. While the adults try reaching Houdini in a Séance at his former home, the children, unknowingly, call upon the master magician through a pair of handcuffs from one of their father's magic collections. Houdini, in desperate need of their help, reveals a hidden notebook filled with scientific formulas coveted by both benevolent and malevolent secret circles. The notebook is a puzzle, locked behind Houdini's cryptic code. This series of events sets off a thrilling chase, as the pursuit of Houdini's notebook holds the key to many secrets and adventures. In *Houdini's Last Handcuffs*, readers will be mesmerized and tantalized by every twist and turn that leads them on a riveting journey in a world where magic meets science.

Houdini's Last Handcuffs is Cheryl's debut novel. Raised on Manhattan's Upper West Side, she graduated from Finch College before going on to earn an MBA from Columbia University. In addition to having a successful career in finance, Cheryl is on the Board of the Finch College Alumni Foundation Trust, whose fundraising activities focus on awarding grants to women attending community college in the Tri-State Area (New York/New Jersey/Connecticut) who seek a four-year degree. The mother of 2 daughters & 1 son, and grandmother of 10, Cheryl and husband, Jan Deknatel, divide their time between Miami, Florida and rural life in Essex, Connecticut.
