Distinguished Finch Professor to be Honored Along with Remarkable Finch Alumnae at 25th Annual Jessica Cosgrave Awards

JILL WALDHEIM CHAMBERLAIN



Jill Chamberlain attended Finch from 1970-1973, earning her Bachelor of Arts in English. Following graduation, Jill completed the Publishing Procedures Course at Radcliffe College in Cambridge, MA to beginning her career in publishing. Jill first entered the world of book publishing in NYC, then moved to Baltimore, MD to join the

medical publishing field. Other positions followed at the National Academy of Sciences in Washington, DC and Louisiana State University in New Orleans, LA. In 1985, Jill launched her own business, Chamberlain Medical Communications. Focusing on continuing medical education for physicians and nurses, Jill traveled the world, reporting on findings from medical meetings in Taiwan, Helsinki, Buenos Aires and Toronto, among other locations. In 2007, Jill joined Medscape, the professional education division of WebMD, the leading provider of online health information. Although "retired" from the company in 2014, Jill continues to freelance. Jill lives in Jensen Beach, FL and her two children, Lauren Chamberlain Yarborough, 26, and Christian William Chamberlain, 22, live nearby. Linda attended Finch from 1970-1972, and studied further at the Neighborhood Playhouse and the Lee Strasberg Institute. Linda has starred in over 45 made-for-ty movies.



Recent recurring TV roles include The Oath, Homeland, The Office, and True Blood. Linda, a veteran of Broadway (The Adventures of Tom Sawyer and Getting and Spending), has also made off-Broadway and many regional appearances (Romeo and Juliet, Hedda Gabler, A Glass Menagerie, A Streetcar Named Desire, A Doll's House, The Miracle Worker, Grease, The King and I, etc.) at such theatres as Long Wharf, Old Globe, South Coast Repertory, Santa Fe Opera, Laguna Playhouse, Williamstown Theatre Festival, with additional theatrical appearances in Monaco and Japan. Among her many accomplishments, Linda was Founding Director of the California International Theatre Festival. Singing is another of Linda's talents, and past concert appearances include Catalina Jazz Club, 54 Below, Naples Philharmonic, in addition to clubs in London, Paris and Tokyo. Linda is currently touring in *The Year of Magical Thinking*, in addition to solo concert appearances, including Midnight Caravan-Celebrating the Great Ladies of the Glamourous Nightclub Era, and releasing solo albums.

Carol Ann Rinzler graduated as Class President in 1959 with B.A. and earned M.A. in History (specializing in the French Revolution) from Columbia

During her parents' 10 years of living abroad, she and her brother, Aram, were born in Florence; brother Damon was born in Paris, and sister & Finch alum, Obron, was born in San Miguel de Allende, Mexico, attended Finch during its last two years before transferring to Barnard. She lives in Easthampton. Today, Aram is a builder in Santa Fe, where Alba's family owns a house that he built; Damon, a recognized landscape architect, lives with his family in Minneapolis.

Alba grew up in East Hampton, New York where her family continues to maintain a home. The town had — and still has - a wonderful community theater — where she played summer stock from ages 10-15.

After graduating from public school, she attended Finch on scholarship from 1968-1972, which she fulfilled by working 20 hours per week in the Finch library. There, she majored in Art History with a focus on African and Asian art, and went on FISP (Finch International Study Plan) during her junior year which afforded her the opportunity to study in Spain, Italy, France and England. She credits Finch with providing her the opportunity to satisfy her curiosity to travel.

Alba met Broadway and Hollywood actor, Jim Karen, in Easthampton at age 10. After she graduated from Finch, they worked together at the American Place Theatre, under the direction of Finch theater professor,

Isaiah Sheffer, who later became a Founder of Symphony Space, a performing arts venue on Manhattan's Upper West Side.

Together since 1972, Alba and Jim were married in 1989.

Fast forward to now. During Jim's illness that began more than 4 years ago, Alba focused on him completely for a year and a half. While he spent time in hospice — a move that usually signals "end of life care," Alba began



questioning whether Jim - and she — were truly prepared to face the end of life. Since she was in no way ready to lose her husband, she put all of her energy and spirit into keeping him alive. Jim was in a physically weakened condition, and likely would have followed hospice's path leading to the end of life, but through sheer will power, determination and persistence, they succeeded in "graduating him" from hospice. Their former active lifestyle which had consisted of busy careers, travel and social activities

came to a sudden halt, but as Jim gradually became well enough to participate again in living, they started life anew. Up until Jim's death on October 23, 2018, they had to make some lifestyle adjustments, keeping a mindful balance of peace and calm, time with the people they cared about most, and activities they could enjoy together.

These days, due to many life changes, Alba is busy putting her priorities in order: good health, more time to spend with family, loved ones and friends, and finding joy in living every

day to its fullest, such as deriving pleasure and satisfaction from cooking a gourmet meal or spending time in her studio working on textile art/quilt work.

Today, Alba is on the Board – and is Co-Chair of Development – for The Actors Fund Los Angeles. Her chief responsibility is fundraising for this active non-profit whose focus is on helping individuals working in all aspects of the entertainment industry to live comfortably. Alba focuses mainly on The Hollywood Arts Collective, which has pledged provide 150 apartments comprised of studios and 1, 2 & 3bedroom apartments which will be priced in the affordable range of \$600 - \$900 per month for

members who work entertainment industry and the arts. In addition to this residence, the complex will have a theater, rehearsal spaces, two art galleries, an outdoor amphitheater, recording studios and retail space. The organization has also partnered with the federally-funded, Policy Youth Initiatives, introduces underserved children to the Residents will teach their particular disciplines - dance, writing, acting and painting - to these youngsters.
