

AGNES EILEEN BIRNBAUM



"Finch was my first and only choice when I applied to college, so it is a good thing I was accepted!" recalls Agnes Birnbaum. "I was just a few days past my 17th birthday when I appeared in Dean Harries' office for an interview, wearing braces, knee socks and a cast on my arm from having just fallen off a bicycle. Dean Harries was apparently up for the challenge of turning this teenager into a proper young lady."

Agnes worked at NEWSWEEK magazine as a News Assistant and freelance contributor for more than two decades. "I owe my good fortune to Finch alum and good friend, Virginia Handal. Virginia was working at the magazine and suggested I go to their HR dept. One of the questions on the job application was:

Why do you want to work at NEWSWEEK? Contemplating my reply, I noticed the wooden pencil in my hand was embossed with the magazine's famous slogan: NEWSWEEK – THE WORLD'S MOST QUOTED NEWS-WEEKLY. Duly inspired, I wrote that as my reply, and lo and behold, I was hired!"

After NEWSWEEK, Agnes wrote freelance articles for national and international publications, press releases and speeches. She then worked with the Manhattan Chamber of Commerce promoting membership. Agnes also worked at TIFFANY & Co. for several Christmas seasons. "My mother worked at the famed flagship store while I was growing up, and I was enthralled by the stories she told. My own experience did not disappoint, and I even learned the art of tying the Tiffany bow!"

Agnes is currently pursuing screenwriting, having taken classes at NYU and The New School. Thanks to Joan Rivers, Agnes became a professional comedy writer when Joan bought some of her material! She has completed a contemporary dramatic screenplay and three romantic comedy screenplays, and is searching for a producer.

Piqued by the Anthropology courses she took at Finch studying cultures around the world, Agnes has enjoyed her travels. A favorite trip was a tour to the South Pacific, including Tahiti, Fiji, Australia and New Zealand. "I had long wanted to see those places ever since seeing the films Mutiny On the Bounty and South Pacific."





Agnes has been involved in numerous charitable causes in a variety of areas, but says her most enjoyable way of giving back is working with children who need a bit of focus whether it is with their homework or thinking about future career possibilities.

As Joy Correge explains, "transferring to Finch College in my sophomore year, I was coming from a religious college and I was looking for a small liberal arts college in Manhattan where I could commute to school. I was delighted to find Finch. After my interview with Sara Arthur, I knew I had found what I wanted. Classes were smaller, professors were secular and sophisticated; some students were famous, but most were from different backgrounds and religions and eager to enjoy everything New York City had to offer. And we did just that. We went to the Metropolitan Museum of Art, Broadway shows, and ballet performances. We even had a field trip to an artist's loft in Soho, when that area still had warehouses, and was definitely not the fashionable Soho of today."

"I founded the Dance Club at Finch," recalls Joy, "and organized performances of dance companies in the Finch auditorium. I was able to do this because the college appreciated all forms of art and encouraged us students to participate. My interest in dance was fostered by my mother, Adelaide Varricchio Fitzgerald, who danced with the New York City Ballet. As a young girl I attended the School of American Ballet (SAB) on a scholarship. When my mother passed away, I donated a scholarship in her name to SAB."

Joy graduated with a B.A. in English in 1970, and says Finch had a strong impact on her life-long career in business comunications. "My English professors – Drs. Iris Mueller, Carol Hawkes, and Jane Miller Ross – required excellent use of grammar. Their standards helped in my career as an editor for more than 35 years in a variety of business publications. Also instrumental was the course I took in law given by the remarkable Honor-

able Gertrud Mainzer, a German-Jewish refugee who experienced the horrors of enslavement in two concentration camps during World War II. Most of my editorial writing required summarizing law or arbitration cases, a technique I learned in her class." Joy pursued further education, earning a M.A. in Liberal Studies in 1988 from the New School University.

Joy says Finch provided many benefits beyond educational, that continue to this day. "I met friends during my years at Finch College I still have today. Even though Finch closed in 1975, the spirit of Finch lives on through the Finch College Alumni Association Foundation Trust. Through our fundraising events, our foundation provides scholarships to help young women today achieve their educational goals."

"The Finch Museum was a fantastic resource," says Lesley. "I remember Mrs. Varian arranging for me to visit Roy Lichtenstein's loft so I could glean personal insights into his work for a term paper. After graduating from Finch, I joined my mother in what transitioned into a custom made women's fashion boutique. My Art History background still inspires my designs." In addition to her Finch classes, Lesley studied interior design.

After heading her family apparel business, MIRIAM RIGLER, Lesley founded LARK AND RIGGS COUTURE, a clothing design studio that provides

bespoke fashion. She has dressed many brides, mothers' of the bride, and high profile customers with her inspired designs.

Lesley has been involved in numerous charitable causes, including cerebral palsy research, and Dress for Success. Also, "over the years I have supported pediatic cancer research. I help supply clothing to the Oasis Haven for Women and Children, to help emower women to achieve new and better lives."

Lesley is thrilled to see Finch College's mission being kept alive today. "Being able to assist present and future women's leaders through Finch's scholarship is a privilege. The positive opportunity to empower women to set new goals that Finch has espoused is reflected in the warm and nourishing Finch friendships I have made over the years."

Ilene's decision to attend Finch wasn't a hard one, she explains, "when I was at Professionals Children's School, I really liked the idea of being in a small college setting. Regular junior high school was a shock and NYU was too big. Finch had the personal touch of a small school." Ilene's driving passion has always been acting, it "defined who I was. I wasn't happy unless I was acting", but she explains, "I wanted to make my dad happy by attending college and a friend told me about Finch."

Ilene explains that "Between graduation from high school and starting Finch I was having health issues. I was misdiagnosed by my family doctor", who missed her thyroid problem and instead, "called me lazy". It made for a year of mixed

emotions, "I wasn't feeling like myself. I was about 30 pounds heavier because of the thyroid and I kept feeling like this isn't really me. One day I just realized I couldn't get through my history final." Her year at Finch served as a way, "to go back to the core of who I was and what I am is a performer." She describes Finch as a "genteel and nice place to be. The school operated in a way that was lovely and it was so much easier to be educated without the coed element. No distracting pushy men!" At Finch, "I met my best friend, and we're still best friends." Ilene also added, "1969 was a pivotal year. The Vietnam war was still going on and life was changing around us. I was part of a group that went to Washington for the Anti-Vietnam protests. We started in skirts and ended in pants!" Finch, "gave me the security of a place to figure out what I wanted for my life. It gave me camaraderie. I learned a lot about myself that year."

A Drama and Art History minor, Ilene remembers, "Betty Lowe was an extraordinary dance professor. Her class was an oasis in the middle of my health crisis. Betty always resurrected me. She was a beautiful, lovely woman."

Ilene left Finch in 1970 and joined the Broadway cast of *Grease* as the lead. Ilene began working as an actress and dancer at the age of 14, and her year at Finch served as a springboard to her prolific acting and entertainment career. She is best known for her roles as Delia Ryan in the ABC soap opera *Ryan's Hope*, and her Emmy-nominated performances as Roxy Balsom on *One Life to Live*. Ilene is also an accomplished singer, songwriter, and all-around performer. Her most recent album is called, "...I'm not done with u yet". She currently resides in New York, with her boyfriend, director Gary Donatelli.



Jennifer Loving reminisces, "It was my father who suggested that I go to Finch. He lived in New York City and was impressed by the women he knew who had attended Finch College. I spent the last two years of high school in Gstaad, Switzerland and was therefore making a college decision from afar. It turned out to be a very good one, and two of my friends from my Swiss school followed me to Finch. Hearing traffic noise and being in the hustle and bustle of Manhattan was a far cry from listening to the cowbells on the way to classes or hearing the swish of skis on the snowy slopes."

"By far the most important part of my experience at Finch was making friends with girls from all over the United States. I lived in North Hall and I'll never forget putting on our "robes" at night and dashing across the street to Stark's for some hot apple pie a la mode, to go."

Jennifer relates how her chosen field of study at Finch, Art History has impacted her life.

"Finch had the best History of Art program in America with the most outstanding professors, particularly Dr. Mount and Dr. Kelder. This led later to my getting a degree in Interior Design at Parsons School of Design."

Earning a B.A. in Art History from Finch in 1971, Jennifer headed for Paris, working for Peat, Marwick and Mitchell and then TWA. After working for a Senior Congressman in Washington, DC, Jennifer then landed in Saudia Arabia, where she tutored the three daughters of Prince Faisal bin Fahd (son of the Crown Prince King Fahd).

Jennifer describes Prince Faisal's palace as "really like a very large home, but there was no pool. Because of the extreme heat and also I thought it would be a good idea for the princesses to learn to swim, I suggested that they install a

pool. I was able to see it's excavation before I left." (This was perhaps an early indication of Jennifer's later design career?) Jennifer also accompanied Saudi Arabia's first delegation to the Olympics in Montreal and was their social organizer.

Jennifer also volunteers at St. Edwards Guild, a charitable group, and is a member of the French Heritage Society. Jennifer's daughter, Olivia, has just moved to NYC.

When asked why Finch, Jane Drake Piechota replied, "My gosh! It's in New York City!". Jane has many fond memories of attending Finch, one story that came to mind was, "When I was a freshman living at North Hall, we would order pizza at midnight. The delivery man would come, and we would lower our money with a rope, and pull up the pizza to the second floor."

Through FISP, the Finch International Study Plan, Jane had the opportunity to travel and make lasting friendships, "FISP is a part of me, some of my best friends are from FISP. Missy Allen, Dany Rowley Colt, Sally Lee, Melinda Greason, Patience Ferris Sandrof (a Finch roommate), and many, many more." A fond memory from FISP, was of Priscilla Cole Perkins, the student advisor the year Jane went on FISP, "I thought of her as an older sister and was grateful that her door was always open for chats and aspirin. She accompanied me on an errand to a second-hand store in the Paris Metro Station. I

had been thinking of buying a 'sorciere', a convex mirror that reminded me of Jan Van Eyck's "Arnolfini's Wedding" from 1434 and wanted a second opinion. The 'sorciere' in the painting shows the artist who is not visible otherwise. I still have my 'sorciere' that reminds me of "Miss Cole", and that fabulous year."

On how the Finch experience prepared her for the future, Jane said, "It opened up a world that I had only been slightly exposed to and encouraged me to pursue museum work." Jane Drake Piechota graduated from Finch College in 1970 with a BA in Art History. She spent a year at Parrish Art Museum working as curatorial assistant and completed a course in Museum Studies. Jane and her husband, Dennis, established a private conservation laboratory workshop in 1978. She has gone on to work, in this capacity, for the Embassy of the Republic of Iraq & The US Department of State, UCLA Library, The Harvard Museum of the Ancient Near East, and The Peabody Museum of Archaeology & Ethnology. Most recently, "Dennis and I have retired from our conservation practice. Last year in March, 2020 our primary clients, two museums at Harvard University, closed their doors due to the

epidemic. That suited us. We had discussed our retirement for several years and since future contracts were now off the table, we shook hands and agreed that we were no longer in business."

Jane is also an avid artist and explains, "I'm a late comer to making art. After graduating from Finch, I dabbled in silk-screening, pottery, sewing, drawing, pastel, acrylic, and, finally, settled on watercolor painting in the 1990's. Finding a teacher that was the right fit took until 2009 when I had my first class with Marjorie Glick, a well-known watercolorist. Many of my compositions are inspired by the lakes and woods of northern Wisconsin where my family has had a summer home for nearly a hundred years. Recently, two of my watercolor paintings were accepted by Gallery Twist in Lexington to appear in their show, "Cool, Calm and Collected"."

An active volunteer, Jane has worked with Community Cooks for seventeen years: an organization that offers home-prepared food to vulnerable neighbors seeking assistance. She also worked for seven years as Commissioner of the Arlington Historic Districts Commission for the Central Street Historic District and served as Member of the Acquisitions Committee for the Arlington Historical Society for a year. Jane's family includes her husband Dennis, daughter Greta, son James, his wife Joohi and their children Mira and Lee. She currently resides in Arlington, MA.

Sarah Guido Sutcliffe had never been out of Texas when she arrived in NYC from El Paso to attend Finch. Sarah attended Finch from 1954 to 1957, earning a degree in Home Economics, while enjoying all that NYC had to offer. Along with a group of other students, Sarah was invited by Dr. and Mrs. DeMarco to take a tour of Europe. This was the precursor of what was to become the FISP study abroad program.

Sarah has flourished as a wife and mother while volunteering and developing her many artistic skills. Describing her life in a nutshell, Sarah says, "I was married

for 51 years, raised 4 children, I'm a grandmother to 8 grandchildren and I spend my time between Mexico and San Diego. My husband was Mexican. I had to move to Mexico City and adapt myself to its culture and learn Spanish, in which I applied my skills I learned in Finch in order to maintain a healthy environment not only for my children and me, but my grandchildren as well. It was not easy moving to a different country and adjusting myself to its customs, though I have to say it was a thrilling adventure as well as a challenge for me. When Finch alums gathered for tea at The Harvard Club on February 19, 2020 to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the founding of Finch College, no one knew it would be the last celebration we would ever have with Frances Tompkins. Four days later, Frances suffered a stroke before passing away peacefully on March 7th, less than a

month before her 81st birthday.

West Virginia-born Frances devoted her time and efforts to all things Finch – working tirelessly on the Finch College Directory and our fundraising events, and forever donating generously to the Finch College Alumni Association Foundation and Scholarship Fund.

Frances was an active and long-time Finch Board member. Several years ago, when the Board created the "Friends of Finch" category of membership, she recruited so many of her own friends that this effort came to be known as "Friends of Frances."

Frances was the life of every party. Always up for a good time, she loved exploring unusual restaurants, and attending theatre, cabaret and museum exhibitions with her many friends. (She once led a posse to Times Square for a visit with "The Naked

Cowboy," a colorful local character.)

Frances was predeceased in 2007 by her husband, Judge Harold Tompkins. She is survived by her son, Laurence Alan Fish Tompkins, his wife, Devorah, and their twins, Charlotte and Eitan, who were born January, 2020.
